









MEA-MFT Voting Record 2013 Legislature

ow did your local legislators do on our issues in the 2013 Montana legislative session? Here's the report card. Below you'll find descriptions of the bills used in the MEA-MFT voting record. Votes begin on page 4.

The bills

HB = House Bill

SB = Senate Bill

SR = Senate Resolution

HB 13: Kathy Swanson (D-Anaconda)

Short title: State employee pay plan.

MEA-MFT position: Support

HB 13 is the state employee pay plan AFSCME, MEA-MFT, and MPEA bargained with the governor. After 4 years with no base pay increase, HB 13 as introduced provided a 5% base pay increase in each year of the coming biennium. The legislature shaved off 25% of the total intended appropriation and passed the bill. State employee unions must now bargain with the governor how the remainder will be added to state employee pay.

Status: Signed by the Governor

HB 5: Duane Ankney (R- Colstrip)

Short title: Long-range building appropriation

AFL-CIO position: Support

HB 5 is the "cash" up front compromise to the JOBS Bill. It spends \$49 million on projects at Missoula College, Montana Tech, UM-Western, and Great Falls College. See HB 14.

Status: Signed by the Governor

HB 14: Gallen Hollenbaugh (D-Helena)

Short title: JOBS bill

MEA-MFT position: Support

HB 14 bonded new and reconstruction projects around the state, especially at various units of the Montana University System and Montana Historical Society. See HB 5.

Status: Died on 3rd reading 57-43 (needed 2/3 vote)

HB 30: Ted Washburn (R-Gallatin Co)

Short title: Eliminate Election Day voter registration

MEA-MFT Position: Oppose

HB 30 eliminated election day voter registration. The governor vetoed the bill, but SB 405, a legislative referendum, will do the same thing. See SB 405.

Status: Vetoed by the Governor

HB 181: Nancy Ballance (R-Hamilton)

Short title: Authorize school districts to decide the number and credential of librarians

MEA-MFT position: Oppose

HB 181 was a direct attack on the constitutional authority of the board of public education to generally supervise public schools. HB 181 empowered local school districts to override the board of public education's accreditation standards specifying the number and credentials of public school librarians.

Status: Tabled in Senate Education

HB 213: Steve Fitzpatrick (R-Great Falls)

Short title: Taxpayer funded private and sectarian school tuition

MEA-MFT position: Oppose

SB 213 created unconstitutional, taxpayer funded tuition tax credits for private and sectarian schools.

Status: Tabled in Senate Education

HB 230: Scott Reichner (R-Bigfork)

Short title: Cut school equalization property tax mills in half

MEA-MFT position: Oppose

HB 230 cut statewide school equalization property tax mills in half costing the state \$106 million in revenue and seriously damaging what is left of public school funding equalization.

Status: Tabled in Senate Tax

HB 239: Carey Smith (R-Billings)

Short title: Require parental pre-approval of student instruction that might involve issues of human sexuality

MEA-MFT position: Oppose

HB 239 empowered parents to override school district authority to adopt and administrators and teachers to implement curriculum. The bill authorized parents to "opt-in" before their children could be instructed in any subject where human sexuality might be discussed. See HR 423

Status: Vetoed by the Governor

HB 240: Carey Smith (R-Billings)

Short title: Prohibit the board of regents from adopting campus gun control policies

MEA-MFT position: Oppose

HB 240 infringed on the constitutional authority of the board of regents to set policy as it pertains to having guns on college campuses.

Status: Vetoed by the Governor

HB 315: Austin Knudsen (R-Plentywood)

Short title: Establish taxpayer funded private charter schools

MEA-MFT Position: Oppose

HB 315 proposed a parallel universe of unconstitutional, taxpayer funded, private-sector, for profit charter schools to compete with existing Montana public schools.

Status: Died on 3rd reading 49-50

HB 338: Keith Reiger (R-Kalispell)

Short title: Terminate define benefit pensions for all new public employees

MEA-MFT Position: Oppose

HB 338 mandated all new hires in TRS, PERS, and all other public employee retirement systems into a state-wide defined contribution retirement plan, increased current and future employee contributions, suspended guaranteed annual benefit adjustments, and created a bottomless fiscal "black hole" as it orphaned all current pension plans.

Status: Tabled in committee. Failed motion to take from the table

HB 357: Kris Hansen (R-Havre)

Short title: Create taxpayer funded private and religious school vouchers

MEA-MFT position: Oppose

HB 357 authorized parents to divert state ANB (per pupil) payment provided to a local district to create for their children a "savings account" to be used by the parents to pay for private and sectarian education, accredited or not.

Status: Died on 2nd reading 53-47

HB 377: Tom Woods (D-Bozeman)

Short title: Amortize and save TRS as a defined benefit pension plan

MEA-MFT Position: Support

HB 377 amortizes and saves the Teachers Retirement System pension plan. See HB 454.

Status: Signed by the Governor

HB 423: Carey Smith (R-Billings)

Short title: Legislative referendum to require parental approval of student instruction in sex education programs

MEA-MFT position: Oppose

HB 423 was the referendum version of HB 239. See HB 239.

Status: Died Senate Education

HB 454: Bill McChesney (D-Miles City)

Short title: Amortize and save PERS as a defined benefit pension plan

MEA-MFT Position: Support

HB 454 amortizes and saves the Public Employees Retirement System pension plan. Both HB 377 and HB 454 require a shared sacrifice of employer and employee increases in contributions and reductions in guaranteed annual benefit adjustments until the systems sufficiently amortize. See HB 377.

Status: Signed by the Governor

SB 14: Dave Wanzenried (D-Missoula)

Short title: Provide ANB funding for certain students 19 years of age

MEA-MFT position: Support

SB 14 allowed school districts to claim certain 19 year students for ANB funding.

Status: Tabled in House Education

SB 81: Dave Lewis (R-Helena)

Short title: Provide tax credits to scholarship organizations

MEA-MFT Position: Oppose

SB 81 proposed an unconstitutional taxpayer funded scholarship program to pay student tuitions for private and sectarian schools. SB 81 was one of seven public school privatization bills introduced in the legislature and became the first one ever to pass the legislature. In this voting record, see HB 213, HB 315, and HB 357.

Status: Vetoed by the Governor

SB 175: Llew Jones (R- Conrad)

Short Title: Generally revise public education funding

MEA-MFT Position: Support

SB 175 is the most comprehensive school funding bill adopted since 1989. It significantly increases state funding of school districts to permit them to address inflationary costs, increases in student enrollment, costs associated with new data driven school accreditation standards, and impacts of oil and gas development. The entire public education community, including MEA-MFT, helped draft and supported the bill.

Status: Signed by Governor

SR 47: Jim Peterson (R-Buffalo)

Short title: Confirm Pat Williams to the board of regents

MEA-MFT position: Support

SR 47 confirmed Pat Williams' appointment to the Montana board of recents

Montana board of regents.

Status: Failed in the Senate.

SB 405: Alan Olson (R-Roundup)

Short title: Legislative referendum to eliminate Election Day registration

AFL-CIO position: Oppose

SB 405 is the equivalent of HB 30, but in referendum form. It eliminates election-day registration and voting.

Status: On the 2014 November general election ballot

SB 406: Dee Brown (R-Hungry Horse) Legislative referendum to terminate TRS and PERS as defined benefit pension plans

MEA-MFT position: Oppose

SB 406 proposed a legislative referendum to terminate TRS and PERS as defined benefit pension plans and mandated all new enrollees into a defined contribution 401k retirement plan.

Status: Tabled in Senate State Administration

SB 408: Alan Olson (R-Roundup) Legislative referendum to provide that no more than two candidates in a partisan primary race be nominated for general election.

MEA-MFT position: Oppose

SB 408 is a legislative referendum that permits only the top two primary election candidates — regardless of party affiliation — to proceed to the general election. The primary would become a so-called "Jungle Primary."

Status: On the 2014 November general election ballot
